## THE WORLD'S FIRST SERVICE CLUB CELEBRATES ITS 104th ANNIVERSARY FEBRUARY 23rd

During the first Rotary club meeting on February 23, 1905 in Chicago, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Hiram Shorey, and Silvester Schiele met to talk about their personal experiences. Harris then unfolded his general plan for their club meetings.

This was the simple beginning of the world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago. It was created because of Harris's wish to capture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The Rotary name derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotarians continue to take pride in their history. In honor of that first club, Rotarians have preserved its original meeting place, Room 711 in Chicago's Unity Building, by re-creating the office as it existed in 1905. For several years, the Paul Harris 711 Club maintained the room as a shrine for visiting Rotarians. In 1989, when the building was scheduled to be demolished, the club carefully dismantled the office and salvaged the interior, including doors and radiators. In 1993, the RI Board of Directors set aside a permanent home for the restored Room 711 at RI World Headquarters in the Chicago suburb of Evanston.

## Documentary on Polio Eradication Receives Oscar Nod

In a week when Rotary International and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced millions more in funding toward polio eradication, a short documentary film, *The Final Inch*, received an Academy Award nomination on January 22 for its intimate look at the massive mission to rid the world of the crippling disease. Nominated in the documentary short subject category, *The Final Inch*, a 38-minute film commissioned by the philanthropic division of Google, chronicles the challenges health organization and governments face during the final stages of polio eradication. Director and producer Irene Taylor Brodsky captured workers immunizing children in the poorest slums of India and Pakistan in 2007. In several scenes Rotarians were filmed working during a National Immunization Day on April 22. Led by M.S. Jain, past governor of District 3100, NID volunteers administer polio vaccination drops to children in Meerut Samrat, Uttar Pradesh, India. *The Final Inch* will air on HBO in early April.

The fee for this year's program is \$350, which covers the cost of the program including room and board. We have some excellent instructors and speakers lined up for this year.



## Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) Medallion ... advance news

Starting in July 2009, the PHF Medallion will be a cost item. The 2009-2010 Club Leadership should consider either funding members' medallions or make it a written policy for the qualifying member to fund one's own purchase. The cost is not known at this time but it may be considered nominal in relation to the good accomplished by the contributed \$1,000.

TRF-Direct is now being offered to support the PolioPlus Fund. TRF-Direct is the Foundation's electronic fund transfer program, which may be done either through bank account or credit card. Donors may choose the amount and recurring contribution timeline (monthly, quarterly or annually.) It allows donors to automate their giving and easily reconcile your bank or credit card statement. TRF-direct provides an easy way for donors to participate in Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge. Before the end of February, a new TRF-Direct Brochure (998 EN) will be available.

## Gates donates autographed hat to TRF



A winning bid of \$17,600 was received for the hat that Bill Gates wore and autographed at Rotary's 2009 International Assembly recently. The Gates signed baseball hat was sold on eBay through auction that ended February 12, with proceeds going to help support Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge for polio eradication. Gates also wore the hat in India while he was immunizing children against polio.




Update: This year 38 grant proposals were submitted to the CART grants chair. Of those, 10 were selected as finalists to submit full grant proposals. The full grant proposals are due before the end of February. Can you imagine if CART were able to fund all 10! The three grant reviewers will carefully select and make recommendations to the CART Board of Directors. District 6920 is represented on the board by DG Kenan Kern, DGE Clyde Taylor and DGN Lloyd Horadan and the District CART Chair. Only two grants will be funded and awarded in May.

District 6920 is preparing to begin a DISTRICT CART COMMITTEE - Would you, or a member of your Club, be interested in becoming a member of the District 6920 CART committee?

We need Rotarians from various areas of the District to serve on the committee. This will help us promote CART within our District and to reach DG Kenan Kern's goal of 100% CART participation.

Talking points for this month: Alzheimer's disease Facts and Figures (from the Alzheimer's Association: you may have used some of the talking points in previous months but they are well worth repeating!

\* 1 in 6 women and 1 in 10 men who reach the age of 55 can expect to develop Alzheimer's in their lifetime.

\*It is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States

\*From 2000 to 2005, deaths attributed to Alzheimer's disease increased by 45 percent. Deaths from heart disease decreased by 8.6 percent; breast cancer deaths decreased by .8 percent, prostate cancer deaths decreased by 4.9 percent; and stroke deaths decreased by 14.4 percent.

\*EVERY 71 seconds an American develops Alzheimer's. By mid-century an American will develop the disease every 33 seconds.
