Below is a vital message from Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta - - ALL Governors, world wide, are asked to share this with our Membership.



Dear District Governors and Club Presidents,

We see the decision to vaccinate as a civic and humanitarian imperative. Rotary is not a political or religious organization, it is a service organization and this is the lens through which we are advising you of our position.

- 1. Global vaccination is the path to ending the pandemic and the emergence of new variants. Rotary endorses and strongly encourages vaccination for all individuals including our members who are currently able to be vaccinated against COVID-19. In areas where COVID-19 is surging, communities are facing extreme challenges, health systems are overwhelmed, and contentious rhetoric is dividing us. It is critical that the virus be contained so that the world may begin to heal. To that end, the purpose of this statement is to reinforce Rotary's position.
- 2. Misinformation has become an "infodemic" that hinders the fight against COVID-19. In line with our Four-Way Test, Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation are committed to providing our members with science-based information.
- 3. Rotary International staff at One Rotary Center were required to be vaccinated by 10 October 2021, as a criterion for employment after that date. RI's employee vaccination rate stands at over 99 percent.
- 4. Globally, Rotary is actively engaged in assuring equity in vaccine access to all people. Our efforts have included advocacy with the G-20, and a proof-of-concept program with GAVI/COVAX to leverage our frontline experience with polio eradication to facilitate

vaccine delivery in several low- and middle-income countries where Rotarians are active. While we know many clubs are already deeply involved in COVID-19 prevention, we are working on additional strategies to multiply our collective efforts. GAVI/COVAX is a partnership including WHO and UNICEF focused on global access and delivery of COVID-19 vaccines.

- 5. Those children for whom vaccines are not currently available are at significant risk. Until vaccines are available for all children, the vaccination of adults is the best way to protect children who cannot be vaccinated. Pediatric admissions for COVID-19 are rising precipitously in areas of low vaccination.
- 6. Rotary salutes health care workers everywhere as they continue to provide lifesaving services. Local recognition of these heroes by each of our clubs can help to encourage them to continue their important work. Rotary abhors any harassment and attacks on healthcare workers.
- 7. Rotary and Rotaract clubs are encouraged to
  - set good examples by being exemplary role models;
  - redouble their efforts to support COVID-19 treatment, prevention, and vaccination efforts.
- 8. Vaccines have proven to be one of the greatest advances of modern medicine. The World Health Organization estimates that vaccines save between 2 to 3 million children's lives each year, and the Global Polio Eradication Initiative estimates the polio vaccine has saved more than 19 million children from paralysis. Vaccines are safe, effective and are responsible for eliminating or controlling many other vaccine-preventable diseases such as smallpox, measles, rubella, and Ebola. And now, there is the opportunity to end the COVID-19 pandemic through vaccines.
- 9. The eradication of polio remains a goal of the highest order for Rotary. We can apply the lessons we have learned in fighting polio to the efforts in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.



Small club: up to 29 members



## **FOUNDATION NEWS:**

Four Way COVID Test to Build Peace and Friendship with Rotarians in Bulgaria, Serbia and Turkey

Update on 500 MBOT ROBOTICS FOR 100 SCHOOLS IN SERBIA- A "Hearts of Europe" Global Grant project funded by USAID and the Rotary Foundation

In December, PDG Hamsa traveled to Bulgaria, Serbia and Turkey on a 9 day international

trip combining his professional and Rotary service activities.

He reviewed major project milestones with Rotary Club of Senta and PDG Vlada Matic.

Negative COVID test results from St. Simons, Sofia, Belgrade and Istanbul cities permitted his travel across the borders of multiple nations.

In Sofia, Bulgaria, Hamsa was touched by the generosity of PDG Nina Miteva of District 2482. On December 8, PDG Nina arranged Hamsa's visit to a regularly scheduled meeting of the Sofia International Rotary club.

At this meeting, Hamsa delivered greetings from DG Ed Presnell and promoted GRSP. He encouraged Rotaractors from Sofia to apply for a GRSP scholarship.

On the evening of December 10, PDG Nina drove Hamsa from Sofia to across the Bulgarian border into the neutral zone with Serbia. PDG Vlad Matic drove from Belgrade, Serbia to the Bulgarian border.

PDG Vlada and RC Pirot club president Vladica Tosic picked up Hamsa from the neutral zone. In a movie-like setting, PDG Vlada and RC Pirot club president Vladica played personal body guards and walked Hamsa from the neutral zone across the border into Serbia.

During his Dec10-13 stay in Serbia, PDG Vlada Matic and Rotary club Senta, the primary host club for the mBot robotics project, hosted Hamsa.

He reviewed key project milestones and attended traditional events held in Zasavica, Skadarlija and the Hippodrome Belgrade.

Hamsa met with a large number of Rotarians from Serbia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Northern Macedonia.

At each meeting, Hamsa delivered greetings from DG Ed Presnell and promoted GRSP.

#### **Project description:**

RI District 2483 in Serbia in partnership with our District 6920 in Georgia, and with financial aid from USAID and the Rotary Foundation delivered 500 mBot robots, to 100 elementary schools in Serbia. The project was led by Rotary Club of Senta in Serbia as the primary host club and Rotary Club of Savannah as the primary international club. The project cost was \$76,185. It was funded with DDF from Districts 6920 and 2483, contributions from Rotary clubs from D6920, Hungary and Serbia, matches from USAID and the Rotary Foundation. Six D6920 Rotary clubs supporting the project are: Augusta, Macon, Macon North, Millen, Savannah and Tennille.

The mBot robotics project was designed and implemented by Serbian Rotarins based on a signed MOU "For a Better School" with the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology Development of the Republic of Serbia. The purpose of "For a Better School" initiative is to improve digital literacy of Serbian school children.

#### Key project milestones reviewed

- 1. IT teachers from 100 Serbian schools completed mandatory training seminar in basic technology from Serbia's B92 Foundation. Over 150 teachers from Belgrade, Senti, Kragujevac, Niš, Zrenjanin, Sremska Mitrovica and neighboring cities attended the first seminar.
- 2. The first seminar seminars was conducted by Nebojša Glisic from Fund B92 and the next online seminar is scheduled for February 2022.
- 3. Each school whose IT teachers completed training, received five mBot robots.
- 4. We look forward to learning more about the impact of application of mBot robotics in class during the next couple of years.

## **CLUB NEWS:**

The Rotary Club of Kings Bay gathered much needed items for blessing bags for the homeless in Camden County for Pay it Forward.

Not pictured were tooth brushes, tooth paste, fruit cups, tuna, fruit and protein bars, canned meat, etc.



10+ members of the Rotary Club of Tifton participated in a Dictionary Distribution Project in November 2021, giving out 624 dictionaries to every third grader in Tift County.

Assistant District Governor Marion Curry had applied for and received approval of a District grant to purchase the dictionaries, and club publicity chair Bonnie Sayles agreed to

coordinate the project.

Sayles recruited members to talk to classes about Rotary Club International, literacy, and the features of the dictionary.

Initially, club members met with representatives of the Tift County Foundation for Educational Excellence and Literacy Volunteers of Tifton-Tift County on Nov. 1 to discuss the project, kicking off Family Literacy month.

When the books arrived, student volunteers from Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, guided by the Literacy Volunteers director, counted out the books for each of nine schools and attached labels designating them as gifts of the Rotary Club. Liaisons with the Education Foundation arranged the days and times with the teachers and principals of each school and took pictures on distribution day.

Club members were assigned schools to visit, and the visits kicked off on Nov. 11 and continued through Nov. 19. Club members spoke individually to students in each classroom, describing the features of the dictionary, which is called a "Gazetteer" because of its added features. One child pointed out to his classmates that the books contained American Sign Language; another exclaimed over the periodic table. A third child pointed out the longest word and shared the definition of supercalifragilistic expialidocious, a word you say when you don't know what else to say. Another child was happy to see Roman numerals in the back of his book.

This dictionary, ordered from www.dictionaryproject.org, defines literacy as "the ability to listen, speak, read, write, view, represent, compute, and solve problems at levels of proficiency necessary to function in the family, in the community, and on the job." Members shared that definition with the students and encouraged each student to find one new word to share with their classmates and teachers after the Thanksgiving break.

Tift County school superintendent Adam Hathaway is determined to have all third graders reading at grade level. The Rotary Club of Tifton spent about 30 hours in November helping the community reach that goal!

In addition to the beds, bedding and frames, we helped deliver bags of foods and a small gift bag.


Knowing there are children in our community without beds weighs heavy on each of us year round, but especially at the holidays when children are supposed to feel nothing but joy and anticipation.

## **Talking TECHNOLOGY:**

Quick Tip for those of you who use FACEBOOK and INSTAGRAM - -

We've ALL received 'messages' from 'supposed' friends - saying things like 'Hi, How are You?" As you know - - your real friend has been hacked - - or more specifically - - they've been <u>CLONED</u>. The goal is to get YOU to respond - and then BOOM they grab you as well.

SO - - to protect yourself - - and in case you are INDEED 'cloned' - - Here is a a quick tip...

OFTEN (once a week?) - Type your own name exactly as it appears on YOUR Facebook or Instagram Account - into the SEARCH box - and hit return.

YOUR OWN PAGE should appear. But if MULTIPLE 'you' pages appear - with your current or past profile pics - - you've been cloned.

You'll want to report the cloned pages and shut them down. Here's how to do it....

The Instructions are the SAME for both Facebook & Instagram.
