
We are approaching the end of this Rotary year and preparing for the next administration. As the process continues, I want to acknowledge everyone for your hospitality, focus, and love of Rotary.

Every hour brings more grim news from Ukraine, where casualties and the number of injured survivors are mounting as fighting continues.

Our relief partners on the ground report scenes of desperation and widespread destruction. Conditions are rapidly deteriorating as the fighting continues unabated.

The people of Ukraine need your help and prayers. Your gift now will help airlift desperately needed medicine and health supplies to first responders and medical teams who are working around the clock to respond to this humanitarian disaster.

MAP is preparing to send an Interagency Emergency Health Kit stocked with essential medicine and supplies – including antibiotics, pain relievers, antiseptics, bandages, and gloves -- that can serve 10,000 people for 90 days. 



## Update on Mayan Midwives global grant project in Guatemala

Greetings - I'm sending this report via a quick email while traveling in Guatemala. Yesterday - We officially launched our <u>second</u> global grant with the expansion of the midwives program into 12 more communities.

Our Goal is to visit as many of the communities being served as possible during this short visit. On our first day, our agenda took us to 2 of the 12 communities.

There, we met with the community midwives, members of the minister in health centers, and hospitals to coordinate referrals of high risk pregnant women.

We also had a working meeting to discuss the final details of the implementation.

Everything is going well, though this is a very rough environment. Here are 2 photos from our first day - and a brief video I shot as we traveled through one of the communities being served by this Global Grant. Again, thank you to EVERYONE for your support.







#### 2) What is the difference between http and https? - SECURITY!

Many of us know this, but sometimes we forget the implications.

Well, with 32 mil debit cards compromised and many scams involving online transactions - let's talk a moment.

#### The main difference between http:// and https:// is all about keeping your info secure.

HTTP stands for Hyper Text Transfer Protocol. The S (big surprise) stands for "Secure".. If you visit a

Website or web page, and look at the address in the web browser, it is likely to begin with the following: <u>http:///</u>.

This means that the website is talking to your browser using the regular <u>unsecured</u> language. In other words, it is possible for someone to "eavesdrop" on your computer's conversation with the Website.

If you fill out a form on the website, someone might see the information you send to that site.

#### This is why you never ever enter your credit card number in an Http website! But if the web address begins with https://, that means your computer is talking to the website in a Secure code that no one can eavesdrop on.

SO - If a website ever asks you to enter your Credit/Debit card information, you should automatically look to see if the web address begins with \*<u>https://\*</u>.

## If it doesn't, you should \*NEVER\* enter sensitive information....such as a credit/debit card number.

While checking the name of any website, first and foremost look for the domain extension (.com or .org, .co.in, .net etc).

The name just before this is the domain name of the website.

For Example, if it says amazon.diwali-festivals before .com, the word before .com is "diwali-festivals" (and NOT "amazon").

So, this webpage does not belong to Amazon - but belongs to diwali-festivals, which we haven't heard of before.

You can similarly check for bank fraud. It's easy to create a fake 'mirror' website of, say - your bank.

Before your ebanking logins, make sure that the name just before ".com" is ONLY the name of your bank.

Lastly, but very importantly, use a TRUSTED wifi network. \*DO NOT USE FREE PUBLIC WIFI\*.

They are NOT Secure.

If in doubt, DON'T! - is the best advice. Better still use your own wifi - if you can. Hotels, Airports and ANY public wifi is a NO! NO! - NOT EVER the Place to disclose your financial info.
