Special Report - St. Simons Island Rotary Flag Program Fall 1999

Historical Background and Purpose

The St. Simons Island Rotary Flag Program was founded in the spring of 1996 with the purpose being to promote patriotism and further enhance the display of the American Flag at residential and commercial properties.

It is separately funded with its own bank account, separate from the club's general fund

and properly audited each year.

Approximate Sales to Date

725 single U.S. flags from 2' x 3' to 8' x 12'

350 U.S. flag kits complete with pole, eagle, bracket, etc.

100 Georgia State Flags

17 flag poles (15 feet to 35 feet)

What Have We Done with Profits

 Erected and maintained commercial aluminum flag pole with lights at busiest intersection on St. Simons Island (Demere and Frederica Roads)

 Erected same as above by the St. Simons Island pier <u>plus</u> placed a granite monument at the site with an inscription honoring members of the Armed Forces Past and Present

3. Donated new flag pole at Mallory Park Little League Baseball complex

 Distributed 5,000 4" x 6" American Flags at four "Taps at Twilight" services sponsored by St. Simons Island Rotary each Memorial Day

5. Purchased all new bunting and flags for bandstand at Neptune Park

6. Paid for entire cost of 1999 "Taps at Twilight" Program (\$1,500.00)

7. Donated flag kits for door prizes at District Conferences

8. Have pledged \$1,500.00 to pay cost of Year 2000 "Taps at Twilight"

Still maintain good bank balance, plus sizeable inventories of flags and kits that are already paid for

Future Plans

Continue to erect and maintain commercial flag poles on St. Simons Island, pay for "Taps at Twilight" every year, and strongly promote the sale and display of our flag to homes and businesses that to date have not achieved the "Patriotic Fever" by displaying the beloved symbol of our great country, The United States Flag.

Summary

This is a <u>major</u> St. Simons Island Rotary Club community program that needs the support and participation of <u>every</u> Rotarian.
