

The tribute was begun in 1991 as an annual observance of Memorial Day. We also honor the survivors of the families.

We give special thanks to those representing all of our veterans and service organizations as well as to community and government leaders for their continued support. Guests On Our Program:

The Color Guard is from the U.S. Marine Corps Security Force Company Kings Bay, Georgia.

The Golden Isles Community Concert Band is directed by Mickey Wendel, Director of the Jane Macon Middle School Band.

The New Renaissance Island Ensemble is directed by Rhonda Hambright. The ensemble, composed of members of the community, has been in existence for years and was previously known as the Island Baroque Ensemble.

Admiral Delaney is a 1968 graduate of the United States Naval Academy. He holds a Master's Degree in Business from George Washington University, is a graduate of the Armed Forces Staff College and has completed advanced postgraduate studies at MIT and Harvard. He was a Federal Executive Fellow at the Brookings Institution.

At time of his retirement, Admiral Delaney was the most decorated member of the United States Navy on active duty. A Vietnam veteran, he flew nearly 700 missions in Southeast Asia. Of his 98 awards and decorations, 62 are for combat action and include the Silver Star Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross, 37 Air Medals and six Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Crosses. He holds the Navy Distinguished Service Medal, the Navy's highest peacetime award, and four awards of the Legion of Merit.

Admiral Delaney has commanded two award-winning aviation squadrons, an aircraft wing, Naval Air Station Jacksonville, and Naval Shore Activities, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. Just prior to his retirement, he served as the Navy's Regional Commander for the Southern United Sates and the Caribbean. He was responsible for over 40 commands including 14 major Naval installations and 4 hospitals.

He is Immediate Past President of the Rotary Club of Jacksonville and is a Paul Harris Fellow.

He and his wife reside in Jacksonville where he is and has been involved in many community organizations. He is presently spearheading the opening of HealthScreen America sites in 55 U.S. and international markets. The Delaneys have three grown daughters.

Naval Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps this year is located at Brunswick High and is instructed by Lt. Foster, U.S.N., (Ret.)

William A. Hammett was a director of music in Georgia schools for some 20 years. He is still active in the music field.

Veteran's Walk will be a brick walkway and memorial in front of the Bandstand at Neptune Park on St. Simons Island. This beautiful. engraved brick walkway will reflect the admiration that Rotary and other Americans share for men and women who serve or have served our country through military duty, in war and peacetime. While adding lasting beauty to our community, the walkway will also pay tribute to veterans of all services, both living and deceased. It is a wonderful way to say a personal "thank you" to your loved ones who have served our

country so proudly and bravely.

Construction will begin approximately 2 months after groundbreaking at "Taps at Twilight." The walkway will consist of engraved bricks and plain (not engraved) bricks. The plain bricks will be replaced with engraved bricks as additional bricks are donated. Sale of bricks will continue until all bricks are engraved. Individual bricks may be purchased for \$50.
