Last Week's Program: Jekyll Island Music Theatre Festival

Clyde Taylor opened the meeting and called upon Kevin Lokey to introduce today's program. Kevin remarked that the **Jekyll Island Music Theatre Festival** was in its fourteenth season as a partnership between Valdosta State University and the Jekyll Island Authority. The Festival presents musical theatre in rotating repertory at the Jekyll Island Amphitheatre located in the island's historic district. Since 1999, the Festival has been under the leadership of Artistic Director Jacque Wheeler and Managing Director Duke Guthrie. Kevin then introduced Duke Guthrie.

Duke brought with him actors Craig Blake, Karen Q. Clark, Bailey des Rocher, Tyler Fish, Shawn Lewis, Matthew McGee, and Trisha Stever. Rob Wheeler, PR Associate, accompanied the group. Duke presented general information about the Festival and mentioned that selected shows are interpreted in sign language for the hearing impaired.

The group sang highlights from their season's shows including numbers from *School House Rock Live*, Rogers and Hammerstein's *State Fair*, and *Hello Dolly*. Their talent and lively performances were appreciated by all.

Duke reviewed ticket information contained in the brochures distributed, and concluded by conducting a brief question-and-answer session,
