

Classification Talks Speaker Introductions: Ted Wright



Bill Halderson arrived in the Golden Isles in June 2003. He emphasized that he was not retired. He is, in fact, an executive recruiter and is "passionate about what I do." His specialty is finding executives for the health care, bio-tech and pharmaceutical industries. He started a second company, placing interim executives. Prior to arriving here, he lived in Dahlonega, Ga. for over 16 years. He was involved in Rotary in Dahlonega where he served as club president in 1989 and 1990; he is a Paul Harris Fellow. His interests include sailing, his church and the Newcomers Club. Bill was a victim of polio at the age of three. A native of Toronto, he became a United States citizen while working in Chicago, where he lived for over 10 years prior to moving to Dahlonega. He is married and he has three sons.

Susan Hardwick was the second speaker. She is a native of Chicago and her background includes journalism, advertising, teaching and real estate sales. She graduated from the University of Georgia Henry W. Grady School of Journalism. She has worked for television stations in Miami, Jacksonville and Montgomery, AL, and worked at the University of South Carolina School of Journalism. Her positions in the Golden Isles have included women's editor of The Brunswick News, advertising-public relations director for First Federal Savings Bank (now Bank of America), and a faculty member at Glynn Academy — leading to 10 years as a teacher, where she also served as the journalism advisor for students. She earned her masters in education from Georgia Southern University. Susan wrote a twice-weekly column for 13 years in the Georgia Times Union, focusing on Golden Isles events. She has worked full-time in the real estate industry since 1986. She serves as a volunteer in many community wide efforts. She is married to Frank Hardwick and has two grown sons, Franklin Burns III and Robert Crawford Burns.

David Williams is region comptroller for the S.E. Region of Georgia Power Company and has been with the parent Southern Company for over 22 years. He has resided in this area for 15 months and has visited here during the past 40 years. "Working in the region is a great life, but not stress free," remarked Williams. Growing up on a farm outside Statesboro, he met his future wife, Karen, while both were students at Georgia Southern University. They adopted both of their children, their daughter, Alexander 12, and their son, Brad 16.
