

Last Week's Program:

Frank Selgrath Executive Director C-MAP



Jack Sullivan introduced Frank Selgrath, a native of Philadelphia, whom Jack said "lives service above self." After obtaining his masters degree Selgrath joined the United States Air Force serving in Vietnam. His career has included the start-up of five different health care businesses. He has visited this area since 1995 and became a permanent resident of St. Simons Island in 2000.

C-MAP stands for the Coastal Medical Access Project. This outstanding rural health care project in Georgia covers Glynn McIntosh & Camden Counties. Selgrath said, "We have in our coverage area an awful lot of hard working people who – for one reason or another – do not have health care."

C-MAP began when the late Glynn County Commissioner Henri Woodman; together with community leaders like Bob Brubaker of King & Prince Seafood, applied for a grant to form the program which has three divisions: case management, medical bank and a free clinic. Ultimately the Brunswick C-Map Office will be located in the old Department of Family & Children Services Building at Parkwood and Altama. It is currently undergoing renovations.

A free clinic has already been opened in Camden County with nine physicians volunteering their services on a regular basis. In Glynn County, 29 physicians are working with the program as well as almost the same amount of volunteer nurses.

Currently C-MAP is working from the outpatient department at the local hospital. They see over 700 patients in Camden and Glynn Counties at this time. There is pharmaceutical assistance as part of the project, with the medical bank working directly with 120 pharmaceutical companies. The C-MAP program is designed to act as an intermediary to fill out the necessary paperwork to assist those as appropriate.

Selgrath noted they have 120 lay volunteers, and they are fortunate to have been selected by the Brunswick Rotary Club as that club's 2003-2004 project, and he would like the support of the St. Simons Rotary Club through tax-deductible donations or volunteers. A new site is planned in the near future for the Darien area. C-MAP's grant came through an application from the Goodwin Community Center. The clinic is named the Henri C. Woodman Memorial Clinic. Selgrath fielded questions to conclude his program.

The SSI Rotary Club Nominating Committee has met and nominated the slate of officers for the fiscal year 2004-2005. A list of the officers is being distributed as a separate paper at the November 25 meeting.
