Frank Inman Golden Isles Bowl



Kevin Lokey introduced Frank Inman, retired UGA assistant coach and currently color analyst for Georgia Southern Football and the executive director of the Golden Isles Bowl. Coach Inman thanked the St. Simons Rotary Club for its \$500 annual donation to the bowl which benefits middle school athletics and after school activities.

The event is scheduled for Saturday, December 6, 2003, in Glynn County Stadium. Inman complimented the Sea Island Company who has been "an angel to the bowl." He repeatedly emphasized that he was there to sell tickets following his presentation. After nine years of staging this event, Inman said that game proceeds have helped over 1,500 youngsters get involved in after-school activities.

"The Golden Isles Bowl is the premier event in junior college football," he noted. He remarked that the young people benefiting from the annual game have made several television promotional spots. "I am impressed by their sincerity and appreciation. They used words like: 'attitude, achievement, conduct, inspiration, keeping us occupied, learning to manage time, physical conditioning, obligation to practice, school spirit, learning to work with others' in the many statements I heard," Inman related.

Coach Inman concluded that every Rotarian should know that the young people in this community need the after-school programs. "Believe in the event and support it," he urged.
