Last Week's Program:

Dr. Don Mathews The G8 Summit - What Is It?



Kevin Lokey introduced Dr. Don Mathews, Associate Professor of Economics, Coastal Georgia Community College. Dr. Mathews also writes a column for The Brunswick News, each Friday, "Coastal Outlook." Mathews earned his Ph.D. in economics from Georgia State University in 1993.

His topic: *The G8 Summit – What Is It?* He began with an overview that the summit where eight countries will come together is really not an organization per se. "They have no budget and the thrust of the three-day meeting is to discuss the weighty issues of the day." A group of six countries first began meeting in 1974; and again in 1975. Canada was added in 1976, the beginning of G7. In 1997, Russia became the eighth invitee and the G8 was formed.

Usually one dominant issue is handled during the summit. Past topics include debt relief for the poor; the AIDS epidemic in many countries; developing Africa; and curbing weapons of mass destruction. Mathews believes that the 2004 G8 will focus on international trade.

He commented that the collapse of the International Trade Organization in recent years has been due to tariffs being exceptionally high. Touching briefly on many other subjects that could be part of next year's G8, Matthews turned to the subject of protestors who are usually a very big part of the annual summit.

"These protestors are anti-globalists and many oppose the World Trade Organization and the G8 format – they're against the rich countries of the world," he noted. Urging the membership to stay abreast of the many news articles that will be focusing on the summit, Matthews said he hoped it would be a showcase for our Golden Isles. He added on several occasions during his talk that they should have chosen Blythe Island for the summit! "No one asked me for my opinion even though that's where I live," he concluded.

Adult Literacy Center

Ted Wright discussed the Adult Literacy Center's needs in Brunswick. He urged fellow Rotarians to volunteer for the program and give an hour or two each week to assist illiterate students in reading and math. The program is in need of 16 volunteers to work with young people in their late teens or early twenties.
