**Last Week's Program** (July 20, 2004)**Rotary District 6920
Governor John Parkins**

Past Presidents' Representative Marie Dodd introduced our District Governor, John Parkins. Governor Parkins presented Immediate Past President Clyde Taylor with a President's citation in recognition of accomplishments during his term. Governor John then addressed our club stating his goals for the next year.

He first stated the importance of "followership" for the success of the club. Each member should be sure to support the leader of the club for that year. He stressed the importance of the 4-way test as the backbone of Rotary and provided business cards for each member which stated the 4-way test.

A district goal is to increase membership a net of three percent in each club. That would mean a five-member net increase for our club. In order to attract a new generation, Gov. John said that we must ask ourselves, "Why would a young person want to be one of us?"

He also shared with us details of METS (Medical Equipment Transportation Project), the District 6920 project that is to gather used medical equipment and matches the need of the equipment with a third world country. To date, four containers have been shipped. The goal is to ship one container per week. The project's mission is "To save life and to omit pain and suffering."

Governor Parkins announced the plans for the District 6920 Conference to be held in Augusta at the Radisson Riverfront Hotel, April 15-17, 2005. He would like for each Rotarian in the district to attend. The conference is to celebrate the accomplishments of Rotary club presidents, past and present. The Rotary Convention marking the 100th year celebration will be held in Chicago. You may register on line at www.rotary.org.

At the conclusion, President Mattingly recognized the first lady of the district, Mary Ellen Parkins. She then presented Governor Parkins with one of the three wheelchairs that the club had collected for the METS project.
