### Dr. Wayne Mosley A Straight Shot of Afghanistan



Dr. Wayne Mosley presented a look at Afghanistan through a slide presentation. Dr. Mosley is an orthopedic surgeon in Vidalia, Georgia. He was recently sent as a surgeon in the U.S. Army Reserve to Afghanistan with the 946<sup>th</sup> Forward Surgical Team. Dr. Mosley's presentation was to provide his perspective and to answer several important questions that have been overlooked by the national media.

Dr. Mosley was stationed at a central base that was occupied by the various coalition partners of different nations. The base was a tent city. The teams had to overcome the obstacles of land mines and dust storms with winds of up to 120 mph.

The country that has always known war is a graveyard of abandoned aircraft, vehicles, and bombers left by the Russians. The countryside is barren of trees or vegetation, due to a drought lasting over the last three to four decades. There is virtually no wildlife due to the lack of vegetation.

The Afghanistan families live segregated in family unit compounds without a bond with others. The lack of community and lack of a bond with others provide little in the way of mounting protection for themselves leaving the "bad guys" to rule.

Dr. Mosley presented slides of the types of innocent by-standers that they typically treat. Most patients are women and children that are often injured in fire fights. The average Afghanistan woman has six children of which two normally live to adulthood. The children die due to illnesses or war related deaths.

The country is void of minerals and petroleum and it is a place for "bad people" to congregate. Dr. Mosley's perception is that the coalition is there solely to eliminate bad people. He is ready to return for another duty when called upon.

Dr. Mosley is a practicing Orthopedic Surgeon in Vidalia Ga. He and his wife Jennifer have three children Joseph, Anna and Matthew. The presentation was a look at Afghanistan, the country that is pivotal in the War on Terrorism.

# Update on the Center for Wildlife Education and The Lamar Q Ball, Jr. Raptor Center Georgia Southern University

### Steve Hein Biography:

Steve Hein brings his passion for falconry, artistic talent, business skills, and a tremendous sense of fun to his work as Director of The Center for Wildlife Education and The Lamar Q Ball, Jr. Raptor Center at Georgia Southern University. Mr. Hein spearheaded the development of The Center for Wildlife Education in 1997, and under his leadership it has since soared to great heights. Currently, the Center serves approximately 40,000 individuals throughout the year.

Mr. Hein holds a degree in Business Administration from Georgia Southern University. He holds Federal and State licenses as a Master Falconer, and practices this ancient art with remarkable enthusiasm. This license was earned by hunting with numerous avian partners, including a red-tailed hawk, harris hawk, American kestrel, and peregrine falcon. He has also acquired a Federal and State permit to rehabilitate birds of prey. As a freelance artist, he has received numerous awards including: the Georgia Governor's "Artist of Excellence" award; 1987-88 Georgia Wildlife Management Area Stamp; and 1986, 1987, 1990 Georgia Ducks Unlimited Artist of the Year.

Steve Hein has become a popular face around the Southeast as he travels with the animals to provide entertaining and educational programs. His programs are wildly popular among children, young adults, adults, and senior citizens!
