Classification Talks Shan DuCom, Brooke Pridmore



Shan DuCom – Shan was born in Manning, SC, a small town where she spent her early years fishing, hunting and riding dirt bikes. At the age of 9, she moved to Roanoke, IL, a town even smaller than Manning. It was in Roanoke where she first began to learn the differences between the North and South, as she was teased mercilessly about her accent. As a high school freshman, she moved to California where she graduated from college and got married. Longing to return to the South, she conspired to get her husband hired by IBM in Charlotte, NC. Some years later, she moved to Albany, GA with her two daughters and visited St. Simons Island for the first time. After a brief period living in Tampa, FL, Shan was offered a job in St. Simons Island as a property manager. Shan then gave an interesting (and graphic) explanation of the varied duties of a property manager.

Brooke Pridmore – Brooke was born in South Carolina where his father was a high school principal and his mother was a middle school teacher. He gave some good examples of the advantages and disadvantages of having educators as parents. Brooke became a physics professor and joined the faculty at Clayton College and State University when it first started as a junior college in 1969. It was therefore the only job he has ever held. Brooke described a number of innovative programs developed at Clayton College, which became a four-year institution in 1986. Brooke closed with an impassioned plea for science education and smaller class size.
