# Richard Pitt Understanding Hearing



Prior to introducing the featured speaker, David Williams called upon **Elizabeth Freyer** for a brief update on the Coastal Symphony of Georgia. Elizabeth reported that the Coastal Symphony was started 22 years ago and is the only surviving symphony orchestra between Hilton Head and Jacksonville. The organization, which now has an annual budget of \$100,000, has developed into a 66-member orchestra. Over half of the musicians also play with the Jacksonville Symphony. A four-concert series is scheduled for the upcoming season. Performances are scheduled for Oct. 18, Dec. 6, Feb. 14 and May 9. Tickets are now on sale.

David next introduced the featured speaker, **Richard Pitt**, a hearing instrument specialist from Savannah, who delivered an interesting presentation on "Understanding Hearing." According to Mr. Pitt, hearing loss is the most common health problem in the US. And, it is the source of a considerable amount of marital stress, evidenced by the fact that 85% of all hearing aids are purchased by the spouse. Mr. Pitt described the various hearing aid alternatives available to the public, including the recently available digital programmable units which are capable of actually clarifying speech in addition to amplifying it.

Following Mr. Pitt's presentation, **Bill Halderson** reminded everyone of the Rotary Golf Tournament scheduled for October 12. Anyone interested in participating in the event should contact Tuffy Adams.
