Last Week's Program (Oct. 19, 2004)**Ms. Shauna Hattaway**
United Way

Ms. Sandra Hathaway is the new president of United Way of Coastal Georgia, serving Glynn and McIntosh Counties. She has served as a member of the board of directors of the Glynn County Children and Youth Organization and has co-authored two books on youth development. She graduated magna cum laude with a BA from the University of Maryland.

Sandra acknowledged the extraordinary work going on within United Way and our community. United Way of Coastal Georgia serves 28 member agencies. She mentioned specifically the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Boys and Girls Clubs of Southeast Georgia. (Sandra distributed an informative brochure on the United Way organization.) Of the 28 agencies supported, 14 serve McIntosh County. Funds raised within a county stay in that county.

Sandra mentioned a number of activities under way. The Latin America Resource Center provides services such as English classes and assistance with medical appointments. A new program called Volunteer Glynn helps area youth build job and leadership skills after school and over their summer vacations. The goal is to identify 50-100 volunteers for activities such as after school mentoring. United Way is working with the Chamber of Commerce to ask non-profit organizations to coordinate fund raising operations, support each other, avoid event-scheduling conflicts and consolidate efforts in general. The organization has been making contacts to lend technical support to groups for writing grants, apply for state funding, etc. She discussed the support for hospice activities.

Sandra explained in detail the Family Connection Network. This is a large network of communities that has made a commitment to improve results for children and families in Georgia. Specific "result areas" are healthy children; children ready for school, children succeeding in school, strong families, and self-sufficient families.

Sandra invited Rotarians to a personal tour of any of the 28 agencies supported. She closed the program with a question-and-answer session, and encouraged Rotarians to contact her to "share your skills."
