Last Week's Program (Nov. 23, 2004)

Tom Stroud Thanksgiving Program



Tom Stroud, a member of the St. Simons Rotary Club since the 1960's, gave a very emotional speech; a speech that was one of the very best presented to the Club in a long time.

Tom's speech had two basic threads: the thread of the greatness of America and the thread of stories about his father, particularly during World War II. Tom wove these two threads together. Tom's father finished the 5th grade and was essentially poor. His dad, in spite of the fact that he never told Tom "I love you" was a wonderful father who had a great influence on Tom's life. During WWII, at Christmas, the Stroud family invited a soldier to spend Christmas Eve night with the family. Tom (who was 8-9 years old) did not like the idea of the soldier (whose name was Jonesey) spending the night because Tom would have to give up his room to Jonesey. Tom made a fuss but his dad took him aside and straightened him out. Several weeks later the family received the news that Jonesey had been killed in the war. This had a profound effect on Tom.

Tom said that he saw his father cry only twice: once when Tom's sister graduated from Emory and once when Tom graduated from Emory.

Tom's father frequently told Tom "Stand tall...you are an American". During WWII Tom was trying to raise money for his school to buy the army a jeep. Tom called on a wealthy man who at first gave Tom a hard time but later told Tom that he would contribute all the funds for a jeep. Tom pointed out that during WWII the nation was totally united behind the war effort.

Tom ended his talk with a wonderful prayer centered around the song "God Bless America." Tom's speech was truly inspiring, entertaining and memorable.
