President Leslie Mattingly discussed several items of interest, including payment of quarterly dues, voluntary donations to the Foundation, election of 2005-2006 officers, and the Child-in-Crisis Program. The enclosure provides more information for each.

Last Week's Program (Dec. 7, 2004)

Patricia A. Morris Coastal Georgia Historical Society



Patricia Morris, Executive Director of the Coastal Georgia Historical Society, presented an overview of the new \$5 million "Lighting Our Way" capital campaign announced last October at the St. Simons Lighthouse. Pat said this was the first major fundraising effort by the Society in 40 years.

The Historical Society operates the St. Simons Island Lighthouse Museum, offers programs and exhibits, provides meeting space in the "leaky" old post office building and is responsible for the restoration of the old Coast Guard Station on East Beach.

Pat said that \$2.5 million has been pledged by the Woodruff Foundation and the G8 Host Committee to match local fundraising, now approaching \$600,000. The campaign will fund three major projects:

- 1. Construction of a new 10,000 square foot **Heritage Center** at the lighthouse replacing the old post office building. The new center will feature an expanded museum store, additional programming and exhibit space, a new community auditorium, a research and collections facility and a salute to the 2004 Sea Island G8 Summit.
- 2. Creation of a new **Maritime Center** at the Historic Coast Guard Station. The current restoration of the building is to be finished this month; but the new funds will provide exhibit galleries, a museum shop and an education building offering learning opportunities for children and adults.
- 3. The final part of the campaign is to add \$1 million to the organization's **endowment fund** for facilities maintenance and community and school programs.

Additional campaign details were provided by John Bauser, the Historical Society's fundraising consultant, and Marie Dodd, who as campaign co-chair enthusiastically encouraged support of the effort.

Child-in-Crisis Program Altama Elementary is "our school." Becky Stephenson has devoted a number of hours to the program and the food drive; tremendous needs have been met by the efforts of Becky and the SSI Rotary Club. President Leslie Mattingly introduced Stacy Short from the Altama School. Stacy spoke of the makeup of students at the school; e.g., 73 percent are on free or reduced lunch programs. Stacy described details of the Child-in-Crisis program. As examples, she discussed book fairs for obtaining books for students and paying library fines to allow students to continue to check-out books.

President Leslie added, "The SSI Rotary Club Auxiliary supported the Child-in-Crisis program last year to the tune of \$500; however, this was never properly acknowledged due to a bookkeeping error." Leslie takes this opportunity to acknowledge the gift and again thank the Ladies Auxiliary Club.

Special Thanks President Leslie acknowledged the efforts of Marie Dodd in supporting our Rotary Club, and specifically for helping with the more difficult challenges. Leslie expressed her personal thanks to Marie.

Election of Officers Today is the annual meeting and Leslie officially declares that a quorum of membership is present for the election. Since there were no nominations from the floor, this will be done by acclamation. Leslie called on Marie Dodd to present the officers and directors. Marie called each to the front of the room and moved for the adoption of this slate of officers. The adoption was seconded and approved unanimously. The slate of officers for 2005-2006 was presented at the November 9 meeting and is shown on the reverse of this enclosure.
