Last Week's Program (Jan. 18, 2005)

Rev. Dee Shaffer Harmony Square



Reverend Dee Shaffer is Pastor of the Arco United Methodist Church and Executive Director of Harmony Square. Rev. Shaffer moved to the area twelve years ago. When she arrived the church was open only three hours a week and she decided to take God to the neighborhood. She found the people possessed among other things potential marketable skills. A survey revealed tourism and construction were leading industries in the area. After much prayer and God's leading, she started planning for Harmony Square in the old Reynolds Street School Building in Brunswick. Harmony Square is a three-pronged ministry:

- (1) A school that is directed toward the food industry. The Harmony Cafe will be associated with the school and will provide an 18-week program that trains food service workers for both restaurant and commercial kitchen employment. Equal to the kitchen training will be life skills training; for example, personal finances, childcare, manners and social skills. The students will be for instance those trying to get off welfare or high school dropouts. There will be no tuition. The cafe is modeled after the Union Mission's program in Savannah (the Bread & Butter Café).
- (2) A daycare center that is affordable. Many parents could work and get off welfare if they could find a loving, affordable daycare center nearby. The center will offer state certified, affordable daycare. The facility will also offer training in daycare certification. Special consideration will be given to young women who have children and would like to stay in school. It will be open seven days a week.
- (3) A homeless "families with children" program. The nationwide program is called Family Promise. Under the umbrella of the Sparrow's Nest, this program takes homeless families off the streets, helps them acquire marketable skills and find jobs and homes. It will be housed at Harmony Square.

The American Community Outreach Coalition, with a 501(c)(3) classification, will own the building, and will be the administrative executives for the facility. Dee Shaffer is an amazing pastor with great faith and vision, and a huge heart. We wish her Godspeed. (See www.harmonycafe.com for more information.)
