Bill Blankenship The Rotary Foundation



Bill Blankenship from St. Mary's and the District Governor year after next, brought a message and update on the Rotary Foundation, a message as he says, "may help fill in some blanks."

In 1957, a Rotarian could become a Paul Harris Fellow by contributing \$1,000 to the Foundation; it is still the same today. There are two funds - the Permanent Fund which is an interest bearing fund and the Annual Fund which is the more day-to-day fund. The contributions to the Annual Fund are returned to the local clubs after being invested for three years. The monies returned to the clubs may be used in a number of ways, but most have been used for International Programs. Some uses in the past have been for water wells in India, buildings for clinics in South America, assisting families in Guatemala and in many cases for grass root projects.

The focus of this year from President Glenn Estess is **EREY!** "Every Rotarian Every Year" as a contributor to the Foundation. District 6920's target this year is \$400,000. Progress is being made with several clubs having reached the 100% contribution objective. St. Simons Rotary current standing is 43%, slightly below the current District average.

The target for the St. Simons Club is EREY; the club can support the Foundation, Governor John and all the good causes the Foundation represents like the eradication of Polio and the new project of worldwide potable water.

Money can be raised individually, a joint club effort, like the Thunderbird Raffle of 2003, or a combination of both. St. Simons Club makes it easy to donate; write a check and the club completes the Form 123EN.

It is the objective of this Club to be 100%!
