Last Week's Program (Feb.15, 2005)

Stacey Short Altama Elementary



Stacey's program was based on the importance of books to the children of Altama Elementary School. Stacey is the coordinator between St. Simons Rotary Club and the school. She graduated from Georgia Southern and taught fourth grade in Savannah before coming to the Brunswick area, and currently is a counselor at Altama.

Her principal point is that books help children to read and learn. The problem is that many children at Altama have little if any encouragement at home to own books, much less read. Many of the parents did not like school and in many cases are semi-literate or illiterate and have no time or skill set to assist their child. A large number of the children have had no exposure to fairy tales or nursery rhymes. It is hard to believe that at least 50% of the children entering Kindergarten are 2 to 3 years below this grade level. In recent weeks this club has contributed over 350 books to assist the school in providing books for the children to take home.

Altama has parent classes to help prepare them to work with their child, and the pupils have special programs held in the mornings and afternoon. The teachers have a strong commitment to assist both in improving not only reading skills, but all aspects of learning.

Stacey commented on the Child-in-Crisis program. St. Simons Rotary has sponsored this effort for the last 3 years at Altama. Other Rotary Clubs also support other schools in the same manner. Child-in-Crisis has provided money for purchasing children's clothes lost in a fire, gift certificates from Wal-Mart to provide emergency clothing available at the school, and has sponsored food for families during the Holidays. The budget from our club this year is \$1,000. The program has also been wonderfully supported by the Women's Auxiliary.

Questions were asked ranging from getting parents involved to truancy issues.
