Last Week's Program (March 15, 2005)

Jay Panek *Language Training Facility*



David Williams introduced Señor Jay Panek, who was assisted by his wife, Señora Lila Baeza Panek. Jay is a 13-year resident of the Golden Isles. Lila is from Chihuahua, Mexico.

The Language Training Facility was established 5 years ago by Jay and Lila. It offers some of the most effective courses available. The program attracts students from all over the country, including members of and candidates for law enforcement organizations. Spanish is taught in a relatively short period of time. Our SSI club's own Bill Turbeville attended one of the courses.

Jay started his presentation by having us recite phrases such as "hola" and "buenas tardes." The techniques used by the facility are based on students not merely memorizing phrases, but learning how to form complete sentences through the study of Spanish grammar. Jay emphasized throughout the presentation the advantages of the grammar-based techniques.

Courses are organized as Survival Spanish, Basic Spanish and Intermediate Spanish. Among the courses offered are a Basic Course for beginners, Monday and Wednesday evenings; an Intermediate Course, Tuesday and Thursday evenings; and Saturday Courses, for four consecutive Saturdays. Special courses include those scheduled for Border Patrol and CBP applicants.

Jay's presentation was lively and informative. A question-and answer session followed the presentation. The web site for the facility is www.languagetrainingfacility.com.
