Last Week's Program (March 22, 2005)

Betty Ransom Talking Books



President Leslie opened today's program by relaying personal experiences about talking books, relating the subject to her mother in Indiana. Leslie was very positive about the service and the benefits it had brought to her mother. Leslie introduced Betty Ransom, the Talking Book Librarian. Betty is a graduate of Glynn Academy, has an Associates Degree from the local college, a Bachelor's degree from Armstrong State College and a Masters in Library Science from FSU. Betty was helped throughout the program by her assistant, Susan Wright.

Betty first discussed the talking book cassettes, displaying one of the cassettes, including the packaging and the multi-purpose address card. A machine to play the cassettes is supplied to each user. The tapes are recorded at about one-half the normal speed and one cassette will play for six to eight hours. The system is funded by the state and its services are provided free-of-charge to those with special physical needs; e.g., severe vision impairment or one's inability to hold a book to read. Certification is required for eligibility.

Betty discussed and displayed examples of a number of other items supplied by the system. A catalogue is provided every two months listing the talking books available by category (fiction, nonfiction, etc.). Other items are cassettes for any published magazine; some Braille items, including the Bible in Braille; the Bible on cassette (to keep forever); "twin vision" books; material in large print; embossed pictures; codes for colors and textures; and Braille calendars.

Betty emphasized again that the items and services are free to those certified to use the system; certification is a reasonable process. The Jekyll Island Lions Club repairs any broken cassette players—providing this service free of charge. A question-and-answer session followed the presentation.

Betty concluded the presentation by mentioning the evolving technology of credit-card sized digital talking books, to be in place by 2008.
