# Last Week's Program (May 3, 2005)

# Phil Overton State of the County



David Williams introduced Phil Overton, recently retired Executive Director of the Brunswick and Glynn County Development Authority. Phil is a native of Jamesville, N.C. and is a graduate of East Carolina University. Prior to coming to Brunswick in 1996, Phil was President and CEO of the Gordon County Chamber of Commerce and Development Authority for 16 years. Phil and his wife, Sue, have two daughters and two grandchildren.

In his opening remarks, Phil noted that he spoke to our club shortly after starting his assignment with the local development authority. It seemed only fitting to speak to us again after his retirement. He then gave a review of the highlights of his term with the Brunswick and Glynn County Development Authority.

The first was the Gulfstream Aerospace expansion at the airport in Brunswick. This project cost 3 million dollars which was funded by a tenyear note repayable with a five-year renewable lease. The facility now employs 300 people.

Additional dormitories were essential at FLETC to retain the facility in Brunswick. The Development Authority funded a \$20,000,000 program to build the necessary buildings. Repayment is being made through 20-year leases.

An \$8,000,000 project to build a flyover at Colonels Island and Route 17 is underway with the Georgia Ports Authority. This will make access for the car carriers to and from the island safer and more convenient.

Last year the Development Authority negotiated the consolidation of auto processing for Hyundai and Kia. This involves 40,000 cars per year and kept 40 jobs.

The final and one of the most challenging is the Colonels Island connecting railroad track between Norfolk and Southern and CSX Transportation. This is a joint effort among Brantley, Camden, Charlton, Glynn and McIntosh Counties. When completed, this will reduce the rail travel time between the Mercedes plant in Alabama and Brunswick from 5 days to 36 hours. It would also significantly reduce the travel time for grain shipments from the Midwest to Colonels Island. Brunswick could become the leading east coast port for grain. The new automobile and grain traffic may provide 112 new jobs. Phil concluded with a Q-and-A session.
