# **Announcements from the President**

# Last Week's Program (June 7, 2005) Col. Frank Williams Youth Challenge Academy



Col. Frank Williams of the YCA (Youth Challenge Academy) brought to us a very inspirational and moving program. The YCA enrolls young adults between the ages of 16 and 18 years who are high school dropouts.

Established in 1993, YCA is located at the National Guard Training Center at Fort Stewart, GA. A second campus was established at Fort Gordon in Augusta, GA in 2000. The purpose is to get a high school equivalent diploma, the GED (General Education Diploma).

The school is based on::

- 1. Residential School—Total control;
- 2. Discipline—The children are not in control of the school;
- 3. Diversity—Everybody is equal; and
- 4. Follow-Up—Every student is mentored for at least one year after graduation.

Through the facilities at Fort Stewart and at Fort Gordon, the school can accommodate more than 1,000 students. All applicants must be drug free. The school has graduated 6,000 students in 12 years.

The academy is modeled after a U.S. Army Basic training company. Life Skills training focuses on those subjects that help prepare cadets for future adult obligations. Subjects include finances, health and hygiene, family planning, stress management, insurance and citizenship. Upon completion of Life Skills and receiving the GED, a student is eligible for optional post-secondary instruction, including college level courses offered by a local college or technical school. Col. Williams cited examples of YCA graduates going on to attend the Citadel and medical school.

Col. Williams conducted a question and answer session following his presentation. He closed the program to a rousing round of applause from the club members.
