Chris Smith
White House Pianist
"A Musical Interlude"



Paul Sanders introduced Christopher Smith. Chris was raised in Oxford AL where at the age of four he began taking lessons from his mother, Gladys. He has studied under several accomplished teachers, including Dr. Patricia Parker of Jacksonville State University and famous Polish-Russian Concert Pianist Dr. Viatold Terkevitch. Chris has performed at the White House on two occasions and is a featured artist for the Sea Island Company. He has performed for U.S. Presidents, Middle Eastern Kings, foreign diplomats and dignitaries, Hollywood stars, governors, senators, and honored guests at the G-8 Summit at Sea Island. Now he may add the St. Simons Rotary Club to the list! His debut at Carnegie Hall was sold-out and he has been invited to return in 2007. He returns to the White House this December. (He is a favorite of Laura Bush.)

Chris entertained the club with his performance and his stories. He described playing at the White House as a life-changing experience. The pieces performed today were "Flight of the Bumblebee," "Romance in F Minor," "Claire de Lune" (Laura Bush's favorite), a patriotic medley, and the ragtime tune "Kitten on the Keys" (regular speed, fast, faster...).

Mr. Smith's encore was the "Rotary Concerto," comprised of selections made by members of the audience, specifically "Someone to Watch Over Me," "The Way We Were," "Laura's Theme" and "Mack the Knife." He received several standing ovations during his program. Thank you for the great performance, Mr. Chris Smith, and thank you, Mr. Paul Sanders, for making the program possible.
