Born in Jacksonville, FL, Martin said he played one year of football for Bobby Ross at Georgia Tech in 1989, where he "walked on, got hurt, and they carried me off."

He earned an English degree at Florida State University in 1992, married his wife Christy a year later, and went on to earn two graduate degrees from Regent University in Virginia Beach, VA.

He spent three years in the insurance business.

He published his first book – "The Dead Don't Dance" – in 2003. His sixth book – "Where the River Ends" – will be published July 15 by Random House.

He and Christy have three boys, ages 10, 8 and 4.

His father has been a Rotarian for 37 years and is past president of the South Jacksonville Rotary Club.

Charles read several portions of his publications that demonstrated his writing style. He explained a sequence of events in his life that eventually led to him becoming a successfully author.
