Proposed Change in Bylaws

Linger Longer Communities *Jekyll Island Master Development Plan*

As Project Executive for Linger Longer, the speaker said the proposed plan would produce “one of the most sophisticated and environmentally sound” developments anywhere.

The company is conducting a series of hearings to get public comment on the proposed development, which would include a new convention center linked to a 400-room hotel, an economy and a mid-scale hotel, and a mixed use town center that would provide shopping and dining on the ground floor with vacation rental units in the upper levels.

Vacation cottages and vacation club units – not designed for permanent residency – are planned to be integrated into the village. Almost 50 percent of the site is designed to be parks, green space and open space.

In an earlier press release, Langford said: “A primary aspect of the Jekyll Island experience is immersing the visitor in its singular ecologic environment. We hope to make it easier for visitors to connect to all the various coastal habitats the island has to offer through nature trails, bike pathways and parks that knit together the assets of Jekyll Island into a continuous fabric.”

Langford said the company plans to refine the development plan through the spring of 2008, with groundbreaking to follow in the fall of that year.

He said the site is about 60 acres, representing 2 percent of the developable land on the island.

Linger Longer is best known for its resort community, Reynolds Plantation, on Lake Oconee near Greensboro, GA.

Langford previously served as Georgia State Director of the Trust for Public Land, a national non-profit organization that preserves parks and open space. He is a former member of the Georgia Board of Natural Resources and the Governor’s Environmental Advisory Council.

He was a co-founder and senior executive of high technology companies focused on electronic commerce. Previously he held positions with the Coca-Cola Company in Atlanta, New York, Argentina and the Caribbean.

Langford was introduced by Wank Davis.
