Dr. Daniel J. Kaufman President, Georgia Gwinnett College

On Sept. 19, 2005, Dr. Daniel J. Kaufman became the charter president of the new Georgia Gwinnett College in Lawrenceville, the first new four-year public college in Georgia in more than 100 years.

He described for our club how he has led the creation of a new college from a "blank piece of paper."

Prior to leading that effort, he was a brigadier general in the U.S. Army, serving as Dean of the Academic Board and Chief Academic Officer at the United States Military Academy at West Point, a position from which he retired in June 2005.

The new college offers degrees in business, psychology, biology and information technology, with plans to add degrees in teacher education and nursing.

He said the college's culture is built on "teaching and student engagement."

Dr. Kaufman has written several books, the most recent being *Understanding International Relations*. His other books include *U.S. National Security Strategy for the 1990s*, *U.S. National Security: A Framework for Analysis*; *Democracy, Strategy, and Vietnam*; and *NATO at Forty: Change, Continuity, and Prospects*.

Dr. Kaufman was graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1968, and he also holds a Masters of Public Administration from the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, and a Doctorate in Philosophy in Political Science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Upon his retirement from active duty, Dr. Kaufman was honored by the British government as an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (O.B.E.).

Dr. Kaufman's military service includes tours with cavalry and armor units in the United States and Vietnam, where he received the Bronze Star for heroism and two Purple Hearts for wounds inflicted during combat. He has also served as a member of the National Security Council staff in the White House and in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. He served as a Special Assistant to three Chiefs of Staff of the Army.

He and his wife, Kathryn, are both natives of Brunswick. They have two children, daughter Emily and son David, and one granddaughter, Emma.
