Cowboys & Roses Renegade Ranch ***Janet Carswell***

Cowboys and Roses Renegade Ranch's roots date from 2003 when Janet Carswell started a Christian riding center for children. Its mission was to let any child with the desire to be around horses to do just that.

She said it allowed any child, regardless of ability to pay, to come and learn about horse care, riding and the love God has for them.

And, she said, It helped these children increase their self-esteem and confidence.

In 2005 she expanded her riding program to help children with special needs, whether mental, physical or emotional.

She learned about the benefits of hippotherapy first-hand. She had to borrow a horse and work out a schedule for her youngest son to get the benefits of hippotherapy. (He is now much better.)

With him in mind, she decided to open the ranch as a non-profit hippotherapy and therapeutic riding center for children. In December 2005 the ranch became a public charity.

Her ranch now offers hippotherapy, therapeutic and recreational riding at no cost to any child who needs these programs.

New Member Introduction

New member **Page Faulk** was introduced by **Don Fielder**. Page is a graduate of The University of the South and Tulane University School of Medicine. The well-traveled physician worked for the World Health Organization in Geneva, Switzerland. Later, he was Professor and Vice Chairman of the Department of Immunology at the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. In 1986 he was invited to build a Center for Reproduction and Transplantation Immunology at the University of Indiana Medial School's Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis and to be an adjunct professor at Purdue University. Following his retirement from academic medicine, Page and his wife, who also is a doctor, started a pharmaceutical company in 2002 for the development of new approaches to chemotherapy. They moved to St. Simons in 2005.
