<u>District Governor Clyde Taylor</u> related the Objects of Rotary to our goals this year and illustrated how the object of Rotary represents the journey of each Rotarian as they go through their Rotary Career.

The four Objects of Rotary are:

- 1. <u>To encourage</u> and foster the ideal service as a worthy enterprise, and to encourage and foster the development of acquaintances and an opportunity for service.
- <u>To set</u> High Ethical Standards in business and professions and the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations.
- 3. <u>To apply</u> the ideals of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life.
- 4. <u>To advance</u> International understanding, goodwill and peace through a worldwide fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideals of service.

Clyde has set a personal goal for our district of two new quality members per club by March of this year. He encourages both new and present members to attend the Rotary Leadership Institute Classes.

We are also encouraged to attend the Literacy Conference in Atlanta later this year, and International Rotary Conventions whenever possible.

Clyde promoted the sale of raffle tickets for four trips, which Marie Dodd put together. The profits from the sale of these tickets will be used to match contributions by individual Rotarians. For example, if you give \$500 to the foundation and you want to become a Paul Harris Scholar, you may give an additional \$250 and the District will match that. You will become a Paul Harris Scholar, and the club gets full credit for the \$500 and they can designate that contribution to the foundation as they see fit.
