Jan. 12 Program

The speaker, Amy Kramer, St. Simons Island Executive Branch Director, Angel Flight, is a native of Atlanta and a graduate of Georgia Southern University with a BS in Early Childhood Education. She also earned her Master's Degree from Kennesaw State University in Early Childhood Education.

After teaching for 21 years, she retired and decided to relocate to Saint Simons Island with her 11- year- old son for a different pace of life. After relocating she was asked by Angel Flight to join their team and educate the public about the organization, recruit pilots and promote their vision. Her father, Jack Cantrell, also lives on Saint Simons and is a volunteer pilot.

The Angel Flight philosophy is that travel should never stand in the way of receiving medical care. Their volunteer pilots supply their time, plane and fuel and are ready to act as angels in the lives of others. They will take flight to get patients to the hope of lifesaving treatment. All of the services are free! They currently have 800 volunteer pilots in Georgia, with 16 in the Southeast.

Angel Flight serves the community by flying patients to distant medical facilities, delivering supplies to disaster areas and reuniting families during desperate times. In time of national crisis, it is a "first responder" and on a daily basis, responds to medical crises on a personal level.

Its community service is available for any medically stable and ambulatory patient demonstrating a financial need and/or anyone who cannot utilize or access commercial transportation. Angel Flight serves those who reside in, are traveling to or traveling through the states of Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee. When needs extend beyond this region, they coordinate with affiliate organizations through Air Care Alliance.

Angel Flight is a non-profit organization and supported by private and corporate donations. Contributions are used to cover the costs of mission coordination, community outreach, education and pilot recruitment.

Amy left us with the message that it doesn't take a miracle to get people to the medical care they need, but it does require a few angels. With your participation, whether by recruiting pilots, raising funds or spreading the word, you will be an Angel too!
