Dr. Valerie Hepburn, president of the College of Coastal Georgia, spoke on the master plan for the college to include the athletic program, enrollment, building growth, new degrees, innovative programs and fundraising.

The Plan calls for 11 new sports over the next 5 – 6 years. Reg Murphy chairs this effort. It will add golf, tennis, cross-country volleyball, and baseball to the existing basketball and soccer programs.

An enrollment of 6,000 students is forecast for the year 2020. This past fall there was a 30% increase in enrollment for a total of 3,080 students. Spring enrollment increased by 40% for a total enrollment of 3,173 students. Enrollment, compared to a year ago, is up about 1,000 college students for a 44% increase. The college serves mainly Wayne, Brantley, McIntosh, Camden and Glynn counties. There is a new Student Activity Center and a Fitness Center.

There are plans for 30 capital projects, which will have a public/private investment in this community of \$200 millon. One of three projects underway now is a three-story 50,000 sq. ft. Health and Science Building. It will cost \$12 million and open Jan. 2011. The 50,000 sq. ft. Campus Center will open Aug. 2011 with a cost of another \$12 million. It will have a cafeteria, bookstore, health center, admissions office, etc. It will be in the center of campus. The 350 bed Student Housing will be next to the lake, and cost \$14 million. It is scheduled to open Aug. 2011. Now four bachelor degrees are offered. Two are in teacher education, one in business administration and one in nursing. Next fall, programs in hospitality management, health information and biological studies to include pre-professional studies, coastal ecology and secondary education will be offered.

Innovative programs include partnering with a sister city in China and partnering with the Glynn County School System to develop a Community Center for the Arts for k-12 on campus. A permanent collection of art has been started and will be housed in the Huie-Wilcox Gallery.

The fundraising efforts have brought in a record \$1,049,146.70. The school depends on private donations. This goes toward scholarships and campus improvements.

The budget offers some real challenges, but they are resolved to keep going forward. She does not foresee significant reductions in funding from the legislature.
