- Mary Beth Wester announced that the Interact High School Club planted 62 shrubs and 2 trees at Ft. Frederica. Among the attendees were six Rotarians.
- An American flag with a message inviting them to TAPS at Twilight was put in the goody bags for the returning National Guard at the suggestion of Leslie Lamkin, publications coordinator.

Speaker Connie Patrick is the Director of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center at Glynco, (FLETC). She provides oversight to the training of the majority of federal officers and agents. FLETC services 88 federal agencies; provides training to state, local and international police in selected advanced programs; graduates over 60,000 students annually; and is the largest law enforcement training operation throughout the country. Their operating budget is about \$350,000,000. FLETC operates facilities in Artesia, New Mexico where they train the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Border Patrol and the pilots and air marshals. In Charleston, South Carolina the Coast Guard and U.S. Probation Officers are trained. The Cheltenham, Maryland base provides requalification training for selected officers and agents in the DC area.

There are also Law Enforcement Academies at Gaborone, Botswana and San Salvador, El Salvador.

FLETC at Glynco has a tremendous workload on any given day. Last year 67,000 students were trained here.

The Department of Homeland Security is now 8 years old and FLETC is the integrator in the department with 22 separate agencies trying to become one. They can immediately get information out to over 200 members.

In the future, training will be geared toward interactive types of technology. This summer they will bring in about 80 high school and college students to mentor. They will be exposed to real life experiences in working with the government, and FLETC hopes to inspire some of them to go into law enforcement. In return they will be asked to help develop methods to teach the new technological courses to FLETC trainees using interactive gaming technological simulators. This will be the 3rd year for this program.

A 2003 study showed that FLETC has a \$600,000,000 impact on our community!
