Speaker **Robert Morris** is the Senior Director of External Affairs for the Georgia Ports Authority. The GPA operates and maintains deepwater port facilities in Savannah, Brunswick and inland barge terminals in Bainbridge and Columbus.

Statewide, our ports have experienced a recovery in the last 5–6 months. Even during the recession we were able to add 50,000 jobs. A study shows that 295,443 full and part-time jobs are directly or indirectly tied to the ports. When the West Coast ports closed for 10 days we had a 31.5% increase in container tonnage which we have retained. The ports pay \$3.5 billion in Federal taxes every year, which is influential when we request money to maintain and deepen the harbors. The current harbor-deepening project in Savannah to take its dept to 48 feet will cost \$550,000,000. Forty million dollars have already been put into the project. The Brunswick harbor has a depth of 38 feet. Because of the rock riverbed it would be too expensive to further deepen it. The Sidney Lanier Bridge has been gold for us in that it in effect deepened our harbor.

Savannah has the 4<sup>th</sup> largest container port in the country at their Garden City Terminal location and the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest on the East Coast. This port has seen double digit growth in the past 6 months. We have been a leader in growth and in the way we conduct business in the country, and this has attracted distribution centers, manufacturing plants and other import/export operations to the vicinity of Brunswick and Savannah.

The Brunswick Port had a decline in 2008, but is beginning to see a return. The Colonel's Island RoRo, (Roll on, Roll off), Terminal deals with automobiles, machinery and dry agricultural products. It handles the entire import/export business of Mercedes Benz.

Colonel's Island has excellent railroad terminal interchanges with CSX Transportation and Norfolk Southern Railroad. The recent fire put the port out of operation for only a total of 48 hours. These rail connections allow Brunswick to service 44% of the US.

In the last four years we've made an effort to be as environmentally friendly as possible. We've reduced the usage of diesel fuel at our terminals by 5 million gallons annually by returning to electric power.

Bill Dawson is the director of the Brunswick Port and we were encouraged to contact him for a tour of the facility.

Gary Schwartz introduced the speaker.
