Speaker **Karen Brubaker** spoke about Hospice and Hospice Care in general. Mrs. Brubaker is a native of Glynn County. She earned a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Davidson College in North Carolina and Master of Social Work degree from Florida State University. She is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker.

She has worked in the Hospice field for the past 15 years. She served as Administrator of United Hospice in Atlanta and then worked as a Regional Director supervising several Hospice agencies. As Director of Professional Services, Karen led a Hospice consultant team for United Clinical Services and was responsible for the care of over 350 patients in 12 Hospices in Georgia and South Carolina.

Dame Cicely Sanders started Hospice in 1970 in London, England. The first Hospice in America was founded in Nov. 1980 in New Haven, Connecticut. Medicare began funding Hospice in 1987.

Mrs. Brubaker represents Hospice of the Golden Isles, which is the only "not-for-profit" Hospice here. It serves five counties. Full services are provided regardless of a patient's ability to pay. The staff, of more than 100, is trained in end of life care. This includes assistance with end of life issues, and relationship and healing support services. Eighty percent of care is provided in private homes. Over 700 patients were served in 2008! Hospice provides 24-hour care.

Persons eligible for Hospice care are patients who have a life limiting illness with a prognosis, from a physician, of six months or less to live. Illnesses other than cancer can pertain to lung, kidney, and heart diseases. A patient's length of stay at Hospice is often very short, from just a few days to just a few hours. Hospice takes away the fear of dying alone, or in pain.

Some of the challenges facing Hospice include underutilization of services, threats to Medicare funding and Medicare fraud and abuse.

Janet Shirley, Vice-President of the Hospice of the Golden Isles Auxiliary also spoke. She stated that one of the Auxiliary's missions is to provide educational events for the community and its Auxiliary members. They have done this through "Lunch and Learn" events.

The Auxiliary also provides fundraising events. Through a bridge tournament at Marshes Edge and various neighborhood parties, \$60,000 was raised in 2008!

Gary Schwartz introduced the speaker.
