Steven Spandle was given his red badge and Rotary pin by President Brooke and welcomed into the club.

Vickie Bryan received her blue badge.

Ely Driver, a visiting Rotarian from Knoxville, TN told us about his club's involvement with other volunteer organizations to offer 7,500 free flue shots in Knoxville. The effort is organized by the Rotary and held in high school gyms. They also offer "drive by" shots for the handicapped.

Our speaker was Bill **Tipton**, who is the Executive Director of the Brunswick & Golden Isles Convention and Visitors Bureau. He explained that the bureau operates independently, but cooperatively, with the Chamber of Commerce. It is the destination marketing organization for all of Glynn County. It is the main communication vehicle for promoting this area as a vocation destination, a stop for group tours and as a meeting/special event site.

Their board is unique in that it is made up of owners and Vice Presidents of hotels in the area.

The Bureau has a budget of 1.9 million dollars. (This is 20% less than last year.) It receives 50% of the county's bed tax, (1.8 million dollars), 70% of the city's, (\$15,000), \$100,000 from Jekyll Island and \$8,000 from the state.

The bureau spends 1.3 million dollars in advertising and \$105,000 to run the three Visitor's Centers. One is in Brunswick, one is on the Island and one is on Interstate 95. Some of the other expenses include costs for lighting the interstate, lighting on the Sidney Lanier Bridge and fireworks on the Fourth of July on St. Simons Island.

Food, (29%), and Lodging, (24%) bring most of the revenue. Shopping and recreation bring in around 19% - 29%.

Most of the advertising to create interest in the area is done by the hotels. However, the articles by travel writers are the most effective. Stories about going out on the shrimp boat, The Lady Jane, and other recreation and event coverage create the image of a fun place to visit with lots if interesting things to do.

The bureau has a website, www.ComeCoastAwhile.com. It can be translated into 20 different languages. They have also produced a DVD, which is translated into 9 different languages. Bill encouraged any of us who plan to travel abroad to request these and other literature to take with us to share internationally.

Gary Schwartz introduced the speaker.
