Speaker *Justin Conway* spoke on the **White Oak Conservation Center**, Philanthropist Howard Gilman established it in 1982. It is located on the bank of the St. Marys River in northeast Florida. The center itself is 650 acres, and is surrounded by approximately 6,800 acres of pine and hardwood forest and wetlands. About 1,000 acres are actually in Georgia.

The center maintains threatened species in a spacious natural facility. It is a center for research and husbandry and it is also a center for education and conferences. It offers 10 guest lodges decorated with magnificent antiques and artwork with a golf course and pool.

The center houses both local and national endangered species. For example, they have 4 of the 5 species of Indian Rhino, 30 zebra, 40 cheetahs, 10 giraffes and 25–30 rhinos all in a natural setting. To exercise the cheetahs, they have them chase a lore around a horse pasture, which will be Martin Turbidy's job the next time he visits!

The center works with the government wildlife agencies, which address release, relocation, rehabilitation and production. It promotes the study and protection of both animal and plant species native to northeast Florida.

White Oak has a staff of about 160 for the entire center. Thirty-five of those work at the Conservation Center.

Training programs are provided for wildlife veterinarians, veterinarian technicians, zoologists and researchers.

Opportunities are also offered for both pre- and post-doctoral professionals to study rare species.

Care is taken as to how the information gained from research can help the animals in the wild. The scientists preserve genetic samples of animals in their "Frozen Zoo", so if that animal becomes extinct they can use the genetic samples they have preserved through artificial insemination to reinvigorate populations! Conway says this is not cloning. He says it is conservation diversity!

It is also interesting to note that a Dance Residency was established under the direction of the famous Russian dancer who defected from Russia, Mikhail Baryshnikov. He worked here from 1990 – 2001. Today top perfuming artists come from all over the world. This past week they have the arrival of Sundance of the Sundance Film Festival.

Martin Turbidy introduced the speaker.
