Today's Program - May 17, 2011

Ralph Boston, Former Olympic Gold Medalist, Long Jump and World Record Holder

In 1959, Boston had a best long jump of 25-3 and placed 3rd in the NCAA and 4th in the AAU. One year later he had improved only 4½" and placed 6th in the AAU, although he won the NCAA and NAIA. Suddenly he turned into a great jumper. His winning 26-61/4 at the Final Olympic Trials was wind-aided, but he had a legal 24-41/4. August 12, at Walnut, California, he broke Jesse Owens' 25-year old record by leaping 26-111/4. He won the Olympic Championship at 26 -73/4. Ralph Boston's remaining accomplishments are too numerous to be listed here. We look forward to hearing more during his presentation.

Bill Curry, Head Football Coach, Georgia State University Bill shared with us many interesting stories of his days as a football player under some of the greatest coaches and the life lessons he learned. Coach Bobby Dodd at Georgia Tech taught him the importance of building relationships. Taking the lessons he learned from these great men, he successfully coached at Georgia Tech, Alabama, and Kentucky before spending 11 years as a TV analyst with ESPN. "The Fellowship of the Miserables" as he dubbed the group of people who over the years tried to make him believe he could not survive at Georgia Tech, play professionally, or successfully coach, were at work again when he decided to start a football program at Georgia State. Things like, "Are you crazy?"; "Why do you want to start a football team when there are already so many good ones?"; "You did what, you are playing Alabama?": "You will never be successful." Fortunately, Bill did not listen to these people and enthusiastically embraced the challenge. Football is the only sport that every player on the team needs every other player to survive. The team is based on 4 Fs: 1) Faith, 2) Family, 3) Finishing education, and 4) the Football team. Remember The Fellowship of the Miserables? Bill's policy regarding these people is "to love them, pray for them, avoid them." Bill stated his Georgia State University team loves to play football and will play anyone at anytime. The future looks bright for Georgia State because they have a passionate coach with a sense of humor whose name is synonymous with class and integrity.
