Saving Face, by Angelo Capozzi as told to Stephen Yafa

The Rotarian - October 2010

As medical director and cofounder of Rotaplast, I consider myself a fortunate man. When you're repairing a child's cleft lip and palate and you put the last stitch in, you get to stand back and look at the results and say, "Wow, I made a difference for that kid." I'll tell you, there's no reward like that. Partnering with Rotary clubs over the last 17 years, we've performed well over 13,000 cleft lip and palate operations on children around the world. It's the Rotary connection that gives us our name. I joined the Rotary Club of San Francisco in 1971, after I set up my private practice as a plastic surgeon. For the first few years, I wasn't really a Rotarian; I was a guy who came to lunch. I donated money, I took part in activities, but I wasn't completely living The Four-Way Test. Then came a seminal moment. Don Laub, former chief of plastic surgery at the Stanford University School of Medicine, had started Interplast, doing free reconstructive surgeries in developing regions, and asked me to join his team as a medical volunteer.
