Georgia Bureau of Investigation, Director, State Crime Laboratory, Atlanta

George Herrin, PhD, the Deputy Director of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation-Division of Forensic Sciences, spoke to us today about the challenges related to providing accurate and timely information to law enforcement officials for the purpose of solving crimes. If you enjoy shows such as CSI, keep in mind they are only fictional. Crimes are not solved in a day and information is not processed within hours. It takes 45-90 days to process information and provide reports. It is important to provide reports at the time they are actually needed by the DA or other officials.

Rotary International News Indian Rotarians Support Tribal School

India has more than 200 district groups of indigenous, or tribal, people, who often live in extreme poverty and face prejudice and discrimination. The Kavi Jagannath Jadhav Guruji Ashram Shaala, a School for tribal children, is supported by the Rotary Club of Thane North. Students ages 6-15, who might not otherwise receive any education, live and eat at the school, and classrooms double as dorm rooms. The Rotarians have made several improvements, such as installing a water purification system and providing a library, a science laboratory, and play equipment. The club also has donated funds to buy uniforms and blankets. "In North America, you register for school and send your kids, and everyone takes it for granted. In India, for aboriginals, you don't take anything for granted."
