Bill Bryce
Sr. Area Director - World Vision
Two Kingdoms - Building a Better World for Children

Bill Bryce has a great job. He gets to help the world’s neediest children and actually gets to see positive results from his efforts, along with thousands of others who work for the prestigious World Vision organization. Founded in 1950 by evangelist Bob Pierce, World Vision works in 96 overseas countries linking over three-million children of poverty to the resources provided by this far reaching non-profit organization. Employed by World Vision since 1984, Bill’s first experience was in Ethiopia where over one-million citizens died during the historic famine there. “Through the efforts of World Vision, it was the first time the world saw such human suffering and devastation reported live over BBC television,” said Bryce.

World Vision creates empowerment in the countries where it works utilizing the *Five Fingers of Development*: providing access to **clean water**, access to **nutritious food** which is grown by the people themselves, **healthcare** provided by empowered local caregivers, access to a **basic education**, and **economic development** in the form of micro-loans to start small businesses in these localities. He offered that World Vision also wants to share the love of Christ wherever it goes, but does not force Christian doctrine anywhere they work. Their newest initiative is the *Every Child Campaign* which focuses on 16 foreign countries including Haiti, Honduras, Angola, and thirteen others, to tackle the immediate survival needs of over 10-million children. This specific program includes the control of the malaria death rate by providing a simple \$6 mosquito net to the masses. It also provides for an aggressive plan for *Child Protection* which addresses severe measures to help homeless street children, children in bonded labor, and children in bondage through sex trafficking. The scope of this effort is monumental and we as Rotarians can help. How? Order a gift or product through the *World Vision Catalog*.
