Program: February 21, 2012 Dr. Valerie A. Hepburn, President, CCGA What's Happening at the College?

What's happening at CCGA? The answer is – a lot! Since her arrival as interim President of Coastal College of Georgia (formerly Brunswick Jr. College) three and a half short years ago, the College has been transformed from a sleepy two-year facility to a vibrant. four-year institution of higher learning offering 8 baccalaureate programs in 14 tracks, all fully accredited under the University System of Georgia. Dr. Valerie A. Hepburn What's Happening at the College?

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"We know we've arrived when we welcome our first Rotary International student this fall," reported Hepburn. "We are really excited about this initiative, as it brings unique diversity and international prominence to our campus. And, a Rotaract Chapter is probably not far behind," she added. Having just celebrated their 50th Anniversary, the new CCGA is growing in every direction, including vertically as it has recently added 8 new buildings and facilities to the campus-scape. "Literally every existing building on our campus but one has been completely renovated," she reported. The college had not seen new construction of any kind in over 30 years. "We thought you did welding," someone recently joked to her. Not only does CCGA not have welding anymore (a certificate program which was migrated to a technical college in the region), they offer robust four-year baccalaureate degree studies in Business Administration. Biological Sciences, Education, Health Informatics, Mathematics, Nursing and Psychology, and a Bachelor of Science degree with tracks in Public Affairs and Criminal Justice to soon follow.

"Last Spring we graduated our first baccalaureate class of 69 students with degrees in Business and Nursing," she said proudly. "And every single one of those students is now gainfully employed having passed licensing with flying colors. That's unusual by any measure!" She described the diversity of the student body. "We have many non-traditional students on our campus, not just 18 and 19-year olds. Many older students are returning to our campus to obtain higher education and a brighter future."

One of the hallmark programs that she is especially proud of is Service Learning. This valuable new initiative teaches students inside the classroom <u>and</u> in the real workplace, bringing a value-added experience to the whole learning process. "We are creating life-long community active graduates," she boasted. With a current enrollment of 3,500 students, CCGA is projected to surpass 4,000 students by 2015. Under Dr. Hepburn's guidance and leadership, that growth is certainly assured.
