His years of gardening know-how speaks for itself in his beautifully illustrated tabletop book, *Vince Dooley's Garden: A Horticultural Journey of a Football Coach* which features his own amazing garden at his home in Athens where he and wife Barbara have lived since 1964.

Vince shared some stories with us. After 42 years as Head Football Coach and Athletic Director at UGA, he has many to tell. Like us, Vince is a Rotarian. He shared that he has made up a few meetings at our chapter in the early days when he and Barbara vacationed here with their 4 children. "I never thought I'd be cheering for Tennessee," he also confessed, referring to the fact that his son is now coaching at that university. "But isn't that orange an awful color," he joked.

He shared another story about the LSU tiger mascot having an altercation with Uga, the Georgia mascot, before a game in Baton Rouge. This version of Uga (and there have been many) was deaf after an illness and couldn't hear the tiger's roar so he was not intimidated by it at all. "The tiger didn't know Uga was hard of hearing," he grinned. The rest of the story brought down the house.

Vince is also a prolific writer. He has seven books to his credit including a children's book, his autobiography – *Dooley: My Years at Georgia, History and Reminiscences of the University of Georgia*, the gardening book, a book about Georgia football greats – *The 34 Most Memorable Plays in Georgia Football History*, plus others he has written and co-authored. Wife Barbara even wrote her own book, *Put Me in Coach: Confessions of a Football Wife*, in 1991.

It's obvious to all that the Dooleys are a great team unto themselves, selling Vince's books and joking with the fans as he signs autographs and personal inscriptions in each book sold. It was great to see them both!
