## Last Week's Program: April 24, 2012

### What's Happening at Frederica Golf Club and Community? Bill Peacher and Angela Harrison, Frederica Realty

What's happening at Frederica Golf Club and community? Sounds like quite a lot, according to new President of Frederica Realty, Bill Peacher. Since Wayne Huizenga took ownership of Frederica and the Sea Island Stables over a year ago, this floundering high-end community has much deeper pockets now to help ride out the sluggish economy and real estate recession. Huizenga, who made his fortune as founder and CEO of Waste Management Inc., has also been Chairman and CEO Blockbusters, Auto Nation, Extended Stay America, and Boca Resorts among others. Huizenga has also been owner and Chairman of the Florida Panthers of the National Hockey League, the Florida Marlins of Major League Baseball and the Miami Dolphins of the National Football League. Needless to say, the future development of Frederica is in strong hands. Bill Peacher, who came to Frederica from the very upscale Palmetto Bluff community in Bluffton, SC, was also formerly President of Reynolds Plantation. Sales Manager of Frederica Realty, Angela Harrison, joined Peacher in their presentation which began with a powerful seven-minute video showcasing the community from gorgeous aerial shots to magnificent pans of the club, the golf course, and some of the spectacular homes of Frederica. Currently, Frederica has 24 residencies, with 4 more homes under construction or in the planning stages. "We think 2012 is the turn-around year for us," said Peacher. "We have already done more business in the first four months of the year than in all of 2011. And, we predict the 2013 market to be substantially stronger still."

Bill also shared some news about the golf club. With golf rounds up 63%, the course is seeing a lot more activity which considerably helps the marketing of real estate. "We currently have ten PGA touring pros who are members of Frederica. They like our course because it affords them a great practice facility in a more intimate, private setting." The Frederica course was designed by renowned designer Tom Fazio, assisted by Sir Michael Bonallack.

Angela Harrison shared news about recent offerings of 33 home sites in Phase V. "Our buyers are preferring smaller custom homes in the 3,500 to 5,000 square foot range, trending away from the substantially larger homes that Frederica has previously seen." The new phase offers residents a more convenient south entrance into Frederica, which is closer to the stables and points beyond. Our new product is perfectly positioned for the permanent resident who lives and works right here in the Golden Isles," Angela suggested. Frederica also offers residents membership into Sea Island providing them multiple opportunities to enjoy golf and other world-class amenities previously not offered to residents outside of Sea Island properties.
