# Program: October 25, 2011 Rusty Bolt, Century 21 Island Development Real Estate Market Update

You would have to live under a rock on St. Simons not to know that our lovely little island has taken a pretty hard hit with regard to the real estate market in the last couple of years. This grim reality became even more apparent when Speaker Rusty Bolt spoke to us at our scheduled meeting Tuesday, October 25th; this being his third presentation to our group. One of his previous visits was in 2006 and what a difference five years can make! Offering multiple statistics that clouded the mind, Rusty's informative luncheon report was pretty hard to swallow, although he reported an upswing in home sales in recent months indicating a glimmer of hope at the end of the tunnel – a continuing tunnel he forecasts to extend into 2013. The condo market having taken an especially hard hit, will probably return to normalcy at an even slower pace, he predicts. He noted that St. Simons' home sales and values have faired a little better than those for the total of Glynn County, where unemployment is higher, hovering at a staggering 10.3%, a full percentage point above the national average.

"The bottom line," he noted, "is that we have to create jobs in this country before we'll see any vast improvement in the housing market. People can't buy homes if they are out of work. It's just that simple. And, they probably can't buy a new home unless they can sell the one they own now." Until employment conditions and the economy improves, Rusty encourages us to hang tough and not sell unless you must, or risk raking in less money with depreciation in home values currently nudging 35-40%. Until foreclosure and short sales inventories have been totally eaten up, not much more will be selling. At least not like the good old days!
