McGladrey Classic Update

From the Davis Love Foundation: John McKenzie and Scott Reid

Introduction by Wally Forsythe

Two friends of our Rotary Club dropped in for lunch to speak to us about the McGladrey Classic – this year's and next year's. Introduced by Wally Forsythe, Scott Reid who is Tournament Director, did most of the talking for him and teammate John McKenzie, who is Director of Sales & Marketing for the tournament.

Scott shared lots of good news about the McGladrey Classic. Like how they're signed on for three more years with Corporate Sponsor, McGladrey, which is the 5th largest accounting firm in the U.S. and for whom the tournament is named. More good news – the 2013 McGladrey Classic will be played two weeks later – November 4-10, to accommodate the tournament's new place on the FedEx tour. This is big, big news because the FedEx tour means "bigger" golfers will come to our island to compete for the ultimate prize in golf.

"The McGladrey brings great positive economic impact (\$10-\$15 million each year) and worldwide recognition to our island as the tournament is broadcast to 200 nations around the globe," reported Reid. "The Golf Channel has really put us on the map during the McGladrey and didn't we look great?" he beamed.

"We had over 25,000 guests attend in 2012 and it's growing every year."

More good news, the McGladrey raised over \$400,000 in 2012 alone for local family and children's related charities, up more than \$100,000 from last year.

The primary recipients of the monies raised will be key Davis Love Foundation charitable initiatives, including Special Olympics and Boys and Girls Clubs, in addition to 30 other charities. It's all good news for Glynn County!

And, more good news – our partnership with the McGladrey as sponsors of the 'Meet the Pros' event on October 9th and the 'Swing for Kids Tournament' on November 2nd raised \$21,500 alone! Another win-win-win for the McGladrey Classic, our St. Simons Rotary Club, and many local children's charities who will benefit from our partnership. A "big" check was presented by the McGladrey team to our Rotary Club! Thanks to all St. Simons Rotarians who supported this effort.
