February 26 Program Mayor Bryan Thompson

I CAME; I SAW; I DID THE BEST THAT I COULD!

Yes, you did, Bryan, the very BEST you could. With ten months and three days remaining on his eight-year, two-term commitment to the City of Brunswick, the Mayor came to speak to us about his journey and the many twists and turns that holding the city's highest office can take.

Never short on words, Bryan delivered a lot of facts. In his first election he ran against a competitive field of 4 opponents (including former Black Panther leader Elaine Brown) and won by a 65% majority. Then came the challenges. Remember the 'move the jail' controversy? The Chief of Police debacle? The Glynn County Water/Sewer merger? And, Liberty Harbor (also know as Liberty Hardship)? All critical issues facing the Mayor's attention during his first term. When Thompson took office in 2005, the world and city were a different place.

Then the recession hit, the real estate crunch chomped down, property values plummeted, tax revenues fell, and the Mayor still had a city to run – but now on only \$14 million versus the previous \$21 million revenue budget. With help of colleagues including the Glynn County Commission, the City Council, the Water/Sewer Commission and others, and with many disputes, sometimes hostile, often difficult, and always interesting, the Mayor is on the final leg of his term managing a city with a balanced budget and no debt, and with only 240 employees to help run it instead of the previous 400+. That's quite a record by any measure.

"It's a big responsibility being Mayor," confessed Thompson. " I've loved 75% of the experience and the other 25% drove me nuts," he admitted.

"During my term, we have totally restructured the leadership of the City. We are much more professional, positive, and operate at a much higher level," he offered. "Good things have happened. I am proud of most of it."

With less than a year remaining, we wish the good Mayor the very best as he transitions out of public service to the private sector.

Thank you for your service and for your leadership, Bryan. Job well done!
