March 5 Program Hamsa Thota

Partnering for International Services – Rotary International Matching Grants

When our scheduled speakers from Glynn Place Mall bailed out at the last minute, fellow Rotarian and past club President Hamsa Thota saved the day with an informative presentation on Rotary Matching Grants Funding efforts in his homeland of Hyderabad, India. Hamsa returned to India for a 20-day visit to reconnect with family including his 90 -year old mother who is very ill. His visit was timely because Hamsa, as a primary contact for three matching grants projects with Rotary District D-3150, was able to attend its District Conference held in Hyderabad, February 25-27, 2013.

"This conference was a big deal," shared Hamsa. While there, he exchanged several St. Simons Club banners and was given a ceremonial shawl, which is a customary gift to visiting Rotarians to India. Over 1,700 Rotarians *(half of them non-English speakers)* attended the conference.

Hamsa reflected on his attendance at the District Conference as "life altering." He shared his immediate frustration of struggling with the local language, Telugu, which is his native tongue, but then admitted it came back to him quickly – a language left behind 40+ years ago when he came to the United States at age twenty. "You never really forget your native language," he shared. Hamsa also discussed recent Charitable Matching Grants initiatives in Hyderabad including *The Tricycle Project - Gifts of Hope* – where 500 man-sized, hand–powered tricycles were distributed on November 23, 2012, to polio victims in Hyderabad. Our Club partnered with Ameerpet Rotary Club in D-3150 and the *Hearts and Hands for the Handicapped Foundation of New York* to complete this project. International President Rotarian Tanaka from Japan and his wife participated in the tricycles distribution event.

Other Rotary Matching Grants Charitable Initiatives partnered with D-3150 are scheduled for this region during the Rotary South Asia Summit to be held May 3-5, 2013, in Hyderabad. The 600 Sewing Machines Project will award machines to village women in an effort to provide them with a trade to help lift them out of poverty. Yet another is the School Benches Project where 1,580 benches will be distributed to students in Hyderabad during the Summit. Six-thousand Rotarians are expected to attend including the Rotary International's incoming President, Ron D. Burton (Norman, Oklahoma), as well as many Rotary International Directors.
