

Bolivian Group Study Exchange Team Their Presentation

I don't know about you, but this writer always finds our annual GSE program amongst the favorites of the year. There is something about hearing fellow Rotarians from distant lands share their lives and experiences that is so endearing and real, reminding us all how far and wide the spirit of Rotary prevails.

This year, we were treated to a Group Study Exchange (GSE) team of four from District 4690 Bolivia. Not surprising, a handful of SSI Rotarians raised their hands when asked if they had visited this remote country in the heart of South America. Eight times the size of Florida, Bolivia is landlocked, bordered by Peru (west), Brazil (northeast), Paraguay (southeast), and Chile to the southwest. Remember Lake Titicaca? It's here, the highest navigable lake in the world.

Their currency is the Boliviano which exchanges 7 to 1 with the U.S. dollar. The average Bolivian spends an equivalent of 16.1 Bolivianos per day to live. Retirement in Bolivia anyone?

The Bolivian GSE contingency led by their impressive and young (25 year old) President, Teresa Adachi (youngest Rotarian to lead in Bolivia), gave us a unique snapshot about their country, their personal lives, and their work with Rotary which centers mostly around safe water initiatives pioneered by Rotary International. Teresa spoke with eloquence and charm, in full command of the English language (she attended college in Canada). Her presentation was followed by colleagues Afran Agrament, Ruth Anivarro and Andrea Prieto. Each spoke about themselves, their families, and unique experiences with Rotary. District 4690 has about 30 active members and is a youthful club with members ranging in ages from 22-50. Hmmm...most of us wouldn't qualify.

Later in the day, we were treated to more face time with our Bolivian guests when many of us attended the First Tuesday gathering at J Mac's Island Restaurant. A good time was had by all.

Thank you to Rotary's Group Study Exchange program for nurturing 'service above self' amongst 1.2 million members in over 34,000 clubs in virtually every nation on the globe. Makes us all proud, doesn't it?
