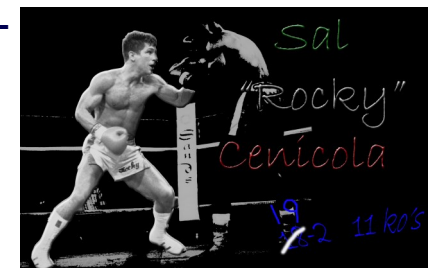

Words of Inspiration from Dana Haza

The United Way's New CEO

After taking over as CEO and President just four months ago, Dana Haza graced the roving microphone at Bonefish with much to say about a lot of good being done by the United Way of Coastal Georgia (UWCGA). Did you know that the UWCGA's annual fund raising budget of 1.2 million dollars serves 28 initiatives in 24 unique programs in our community? Sounds like a lot of money? Not really. There is so much to be done.

The truth is, our community is poor. We can easily forget that living on our privileged island, but just over the causeway, it is quite a different scenario. Did you know that the drop-out rate in Brunswick high schools is 31%? Did you know that 1 in 7 teenage girls under 18 gives birth out of wedlock? Or, that over 700 local grandparents are raising their grandchildren because their children cannot? These are startling realities repeated in communities like ours adding countless problems at huge costs for local, state and federal economies.

How is United Way of Coastal Georgia helping? By getting to the real source of the problems through tutoring, mentoring and hands-on supporting – many small efforts resulting in big successes to help citizens, especially young people, who still have a chance to turn it around. Ever heard of Graduation Blueprint? It's UWCGA's test program focusing on 70+ high-risk eighth graders to help keep them in school and working toward a diploma. The Grandparent Connection, a program under the Coastal Coalition for Children, helps support grandparents thrown back into the role of parenting. The Days of Caring will help give the Safe Harbor facility a facelift when supporters will spend two days painting and fixing-up June 27 & 28, 2013.

And the list of good work goes on, and on...and on. Thank you, Dana Haza, for reminding us of all the good work UWCGA is doing for our community. Best of luck in the new position. Come back to report on how it's going again soon. For more information visit: www.uwcga.org
